On April 22, militants opened fire on Indian tourists in Kashmir's Pahalgam region, killing 26 people. India blamed Pakistan-based groups like Lashkar-e-Taiba, prompting strong measures including suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty, closure of the Attari-Wagah border, and a diplomatic downgrade.

Just weeks earlier, on March 17, the Baloch Liberation Army hijacked the Jaffar Express in Balochistan, killing 26 passengers. Pakistan's military claimed Indian intelligence sponsored the attack, citing recovered evidence. India denied the charge, calling it baseless and politically motivated.

The international community condemned both incidents and urged restraint. The U.N. and U.S. emphasized dialogue, while China offered mediation. With both nations trading accusations of state-sponsored terrorism, the situation remains volatile.
